

Construction Update – Final Paving May 2022

Dear Neighbor,

We wanted to let you know that during the week of May 2, 2022, crews will be in your neighborhood for final paving along Howard Street in Melrose in the vicinity of 201 Howard Street, 179 Howard Street and 169 Howard Street. A map with the locations of the street paving work is on the reverse of this letter. This work is a part of the final restoration for the Mystic to Golden Hills Reliability Project – one of several designed to improve the reliability of the electric system serving the Greater Boston area.

What You Can Expect

Final milling and paving will occur between the hours of 7 a.m. - 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. Police officers will help direct traffic and assist anyone who needs to get through the work zones. The contractor plans to maintain alternating traffic on Howard Street, which may result in some delays.

First, Howard Street will be milled; next, select storm drains and sewer manhole covers will be raised; and then, the final topcoat of paving will be done. This work is expected to be completed in three to five days.

Please note: During paving activities, there will be <u>no street parking</u> in the work zones and access to and from your property may be temporarily delayed. Pavement needs to cool down before cars can drive on it without causing any damage. During construction, you may want to park your car on a side street if you need to get out during the day. Please let us know if you have any medical needs or other issues that make access critical.

Due to weather, or unexpected circumstances, work hours may be extended, or the start date may be delayed.
