- Farmer/Brewery licensing research and implementation



FY2024 Mayor's Office Budget Summary

- Mayor's Office FY24 operating budget reflects a 3.97% increase over FY23.
- The main cost drivers are Salary & Wages and Education & Seminars.
- Director of Economic Recovery & Business Development position is ARPA funded so is not included in the operating budget.
- There are no staffing changes in FY24.
